Lesson 17

NT Book: 1, 2 & 3 John, Jude

Book Theme: Faith Love & Faith Fights

Key Verse: 1 John 3:16 & Jude 3b

Summary: The Apostle John outlived the other apostles, and toward the end of his life he not only wrote the Gospel of John, but three letters, as well. The most prominent themes in these three letters are as follows:

1.) The incarnation of Christ

- 2.) Jesus as Messiah
- 3.) Holding firmly to the truth of the gospel.
- 4.) Living in obedience and love.

The people who understand and believe those first two themes respond by loving God. Loving God is best expressed by holding firmly to the truth of the gospel, obeying His commands, and loving His people. In other words, faith is demonstrated by loving God and loving people, which is where we get our theme for these books: "Faith Loves." John often called himself the disciple whom Jesus loved" (Jn 13:23). He came to know love by spending time with Jesus and watching him lay down his life for us (1 Jn 3:16). As a result, and he wanted to encourage all Christians to love each other the way Christ loves them (1 Jn. 4:19).

The Book of Jude is likely written by the brother of James and Jesus (Jd. 1:1, Mt. 13:55). Jude denied the truth about Jesus until after his death and resurrection, and in this short book, he wastes no time in warning other Christians about those who also deny the truth. Christians must not stand by and watch people be led astray by those who dishonor God and scoff at those who follow His Son. Faith Fights! And Jude calls Christians to contend for the faith, knowing that judgement is coming (Jude 3b).

Jude calls Christians to contend for the faith, knowing that judgement is coming (Jude 3b).
